

## IPP Tag Notification

It is the supplier's responsibility to identify and properly label all parts associated with this approval in accordance with the **Sumitomo Electric Wiring Systems Supplier Manual**, SQM Page 19, Section 2.5.3, *Label Requirement for Initial Production Parts of a Change* (see Table 1).

The dimensions and format of the IPP label are at the supplier's discretion. The IPP label is intended to serve as a visual identification method for both SEWS and the supplier. Colored labels may be used for visibility; however, the use of red labels shall be avoided.

Receipt of parts without the required IPP notification and labeling may result in claim issuance and lot rejection.

Refer to Table 2 for an example of the IPP label.

<p><b>2.5.3 Label Requirement for Initial Production Parts of a Change Point</b></p> <p>For PPAP submissions related to change points (e.g., replacement tooling, supplier changes, or additional tooling), the first shipment of new components must include an <b>Initial Production Parts (IPP)</b> tag if required by SEWS' quality representative.</p> <p>This IPP tag shall reference a SEWS-issued internal number specific to the component's PPAP. Failure to comply with this labeling requirement will result in rejection of the first shipment and the issuance of a Problem Incident Report (PIR) against the supplier.</p>
